The United Nations Women's Peace and Humanitarian Fund (WPHF), launched in 2016, is a global partnership mobilizing critical financing for women's rights organizations and peacebuilders and supports quality interventions designed to enhance the capacity of women to prevent conflict, respond to crises and emergencies, and seize key peacebuilding opportunities. In January 2022, WPHF officially launched its Window for WHRDs on the margins of the first ever UN Security Council open debate, on the protection and participation of WHRDs and peacebuilders. The Window receives requests on a rolling basis in six languages and provides emergency protection grants to WHRDs who are at risk due to their activism, and direct support to cover logistical expenses for national meetings, events or decision-making processes, which contributes to advancing human rights and peace.
